Snapchat: What is it?



As educators we need to be as proactive as possible. Snapchat, although not new, is the new and hip way for students to chat. Snapchat is a popular messaging app that allows teens to exchange user-generated photos, which can't be saved within the app and are viewable for one to ten seconds before disappearing from the recipient's

device. Snapchat's creators intended the fleeting images to be a way for teens to share fun and light moments without the risk of having them go public. The app notifies the sender if the recipient takes a screen shot of the image. You can read all about Snapchat on the Common Sense Media Website.

The biggest issue with Snapchat is the ability to send pictures which will "disappear" from the recipient's device in one to ten seconds. This becomes a gateway for kids to send inappropriate pictures of themselves to others. When used appropriately, Snapchat is a fun and usable app. When used inappropriately, it can be a cause for concern.
